Issues and considerations

Since the Schools advance students from spring to summer - e.g. a Med 2 becomes a Med 3 beginning in summer the Financial Aid enrollment data was obtained for Summer through Spring (rather than as of Fall each year).

Students (primarily in Medicine) who enroll for the first Summer term and then take a leave of absence until the next academic year are thus counted in the academic year of the Summer term.

Medical students may also appear as registered in the School of Medicine when in fact they are enrolled in another program (e.g., PhD, MPH).

The Physical Therapy Masters program is a joint program with two California State Universities, and PT-MS students enroll in the standard manner at UCSF only in the first year of their program. In subsequent years, they have a special enrollment status at UCSF (part of a consortial agreement between UCSF and the CSUs) that provides eligibility for financial aid, but this also makes them difficult to track.

The percentage of doctoral students receiving aid appears greater than 100% for several reasons: some students may be receiving stipends while not actually registered or on filing fee, and recent graduates who are now postdoctoral scholars may be miscoded.
